## Campaign against tax-defaulting vehicles to begin from December 11

Provincial Minister for Excise, Taxation & Narcotics Control Mukesh Kumar Chawla has advised the owners of tax defaulting vehicles in their own interest to pay their due taxes to avoid any unpleasant situation during his department's road checking campaign that would begin on December 11 and continue till December 14 across the province.

Presiding over a meeting, he expressed his satisfaction over the arrangements and directed the assigned teams to work hard to get the objectives of the campaign. He urged them to remain polite while performing their duties, honestly. Briefing the meeting, Director General of E&T Shoaib Ahmed Siddiqui said that seven teams comprising officers/officials of the department had been constituted in Karachi only. He said a number of teams were constituted by the Regional Directors. Deputy Directors /ETOs would head these teams to check the vehicles at various points in all districts of their divisions.

"In Karachi, these teams will check the vehicles from 3.30 pm to 5.30 pm daily during four days campaign at Mazar-e-Quaid, Shahrah-e Quaideen, Muslimabad, Gulistan School, Kharadar, Keamari, Queens Road, Clifton Bath Island, DHA Graveyard, Sunset Boulevard Road, Tooba Masjid, Shaheen Complex, PIDC, Mai Kolachi Bypass, Gulbai, Crown Cinema, Pakola Chowrangi, Johar Chowrangi, Metro Cash and Carry, Pehlwan Goth, PIB Colony, Teen Hatti, Soldier Bazar and Lasbella," he said.

Shoaib Siddiqui further said that the road checking campaign was being launched against defaulting vehicles over non-payments of motor vehicle tax, plying without transfer of ownership, without endorsement of new engines. The campaign is also against those motorcycles that fall in the said categories. Secretary Excise, Taxation & Narcotics Control Abdul Haleem Shaikh and other officers attended the meeting.
